## **1.2 Modeling Techniques**

Various observations involve the cognitive processes (Alwisol, 2009).

### 1.3 Lesson Study

According to Baba (Ali, 2007), lesson, study is a process that teachers or counseling teacher progressively striving to improve service delivery methods counseling, by working together with other teachers. While Sukirman (in Ali, 2007) looked at the lesson study as a model educator professional guidance through the assessment of learning / collaborative service delivery and ongoing counseling. Referring to some of the above definition, a more complete lesson study can be interpreted as a collaborative process from a group of teachers to jointly:

- Identify learning problems (activity counseling) are perceived by teachers (one or a group of teachers),
- Plan the steps of counseling service provision (as the problem-solving effort)

- Evaluating the process of providing counseling services that have been made,
- Improve planning service delivery based on the results from the evaluation,
